# General Information

This catalog contains information on the Arlington Public Schools (APS) 2011 Summer programs. These programs provide students in Pre-K through grade 12 with opportunities to strengthen the skills and knowledge required for Virginia Standards of Learning (SOL) tests, make up courses, and take new courses for credit or enrichment.

Some courses have specific grade level requirements and/or other prerequisites which should be carefully reviewed before registering. Placement is determined by the grade in which a student is enrolled during the 2010-2011 school year. An overview of registration dates, class times and fees follows on pages 6-8.

## RESIDENCY REQUIREMENTS

A student of school age is deemed a resident of Arlington County when the student is living with a natural parent within Arlington County. The student is also considered a resident if living with parents by legal adoption or with a legal guardian in Arlington County. Residency is proven by providing a copy of a lease or mortgage, or by filling out the Arlington Public Schools' forms A & B (available from APS Student Services) and having it notarized. Proof of guardianship may also be required.

Students who are not residents of Arlington County are eligible to attend many but not all of the APS summer programs. In addition, some of the countywide special education and elementary enrichment programs are limited to current APS students only. See the tables on pages 6-8 for information on availability and fees.

## REGISTRATION

Registration forms are included in this catalog on pages 9-12 and are available online at [www.apsva.us](http://www.apsva.us). Registration will take place at the schools between the dates indicated on pages 6-8. APS students should register at their home schools. Non-APS students, who do not plan to enroll in APS for the following school year, should register at the APS Summer School Office. **Note: students with outstanding debts to APS will not be allowed to register for summer school until all debts are cleared.**

Elementary students who register for summer school within the appropriate registration period will receive, through the U. S. mail, information regarding the student's teacher, classroom, bus schedule, and other useful details. This information will be mailed the last week of June. Secondary students who register either for middle or high school summer programs will receive their class schedules, bus routes, and other information through the U. S. mail after late registration closes on June 30, 2011.

If registration exceeds capacity for designated elementary enrichment or countywide special education classes, a random selection procedure will be used to determine program participation. All students will be notified by mail from the relevant program office by the end of April as to the status of their applications.

Please note that secondary classes which have insufficient enrollment at the regular registration deadline (June 17) may be cancelled.

Late Registration for **current APS middle and high school students only** will be held at Kenmore Middle School on Thursday, June 30, from 8:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.

New Work for Credit courses will not be open during late registration, except for current APS students enrolled in the ESOL/HILT program. Applications for online courses at Arlington Mill will also not be accepted at late registration.

## DEADLINES

**Registration deadlines are firm and absolute.** Registration must be completed in person at the student's school, except for secondary late registration for make-up and strengthening courses (see above). Audits are not permitted. Registration closes at 4:00 p.m. on the last day of each program's registration period as shown in the tables on pages 6-8. Students who move into the county after the program registration deadline will be able to register for some but not all classes, provided there is space available. The last day for new K-12 APS students to register for summer school (including those registering through the Intake Center) is June 17, 2011 (all new pre-school students and students taking New Work for Credit must register by May 6).

## PROCEDURES FOR STUDENTS WHO ARE NOT CURRENTLY REGISTERED WITH APS

**In order to register for summer school, students who are new to Arlington Public Schools (and/or registered in a different school district) must present complete health records, copies of which can usually be obtained from the previous or current school, at the time of registration.**

**Health records must include:**

- Tuberculin skin test or evidence of a negative TB risk assessment done after June 2010
- Vaccination records
- Physical examination done after June 2010 (elementary students only)

**Note: new students or Arlington resident students who are not currently attending APS schools must also provide proof of residency in order to qualify for resident tuition (see Residency Requirements).**

## FEES & REFUNDS

Payment in full is due at the time of registration for all APS summer courses and programs (except for SPED students who receive Extended School Year services). **Checks or money orders should be made payable to Arlington Public Schools. Cash is not accepted. Registration fees are non-refundable except when a course is full or cancelled.**

Enrichment programs and high school new work for credit courses also charge tuition. (Registration fees for these courses are included in the tuition.)

**Refunds will be granted for the tuition portion of the fees only under the following conditions:**

- Medical reasons, upon presentation of a medical statement
- Death in the family
- Transfer of residence outside of Arlington
- A student is no longer required to attend a course\*
- A student registered but is subsequently found not eligible for a course\*

\*Conditions marked with an asterisk may be eligible for a refund which includes both the registration fee and tuition. Decisions will be made on a case-by-case basis. **Requests for refunds should be directed to the Summer School Office. Refunds will be processed through July 15, 2011 only.**

## REDUCED FEES

Reduced fees are available only to current Arlington resident students who meet certain income eligibility requirements. To request a reduction in fees, a completed 2011 Application for a Reduction in Summer School Fees form must be submitted along with the summer school registration form (see forms on pages 10, 12).

## RETURNED CHECKS

**In accordance with the Arlington County code, any returned check is subject to a \$25.00 fine.** This fee may change without notice. Both the fine, and the course fee(s), must be paid by money order or certified check if the student is to remain enrolled in the summer program. **If payment is not received within two weeks of the date of the notification letter, the student will be withdrawn from Summer School.** Personal checks will NOT be accepted as payment for returned checks. Any future payments must also be submitted by money order.

## SCHOLARSHIP REQUESTS

Students in need of financial assistance should contact the summer registrar at their school for information on possible scholarships.

## SCHOLARSHIP DONATIONS

Anyone wishing to contribute to a countywide summer school scholarship fund may contact the summer registrar at any APS school for the appropriate forms and additional information.

## BEHAVIOR AND ATTENDANCE REGULATIONS

Normal school regulations regarding the dress code, disrupting class or sleeping in class are enforced during summer school. Students will receive one warning regarding inappropriate behavior. If the behavior continues, the student will be withdrawn. All students are responsible for knowing what constitutes appropriate behavior in a school setting, and acting accordingly.

**Consistent attendance in summer school is critical at all grade levels. Absences and tardiness create severe interruptions in the individual student's progress as well as the progress of others in the class. In the middle school and high school programs, neither grade nor credit is awarded for any class in which a student has more than three absences.** In Summer School, there are no excused absences, even in the case of a court appearance or death in the family. Students who exceed three absences will be unable to continue in the summer program and will be withdrawn.

Students are expected to arrive for class on time. Students who report to class more than 20 minutes late, leave class more than 20 minutes before the end of the period, or sleep in class, will be marked absent. If a student is tardy three times, the tardies will count as one absence. Three absences and three tardies would be the same as four absences, and would be the cause for a student to lose credit and be withdrawn.

## TRANSPORTATION AND PARKING

Transportation is provided only within the assigned summer school attendance area for all Arlington County students. However, summer school bus stops will not necessarily be the same stops as those during the regular school year. They may be further from the house. **Students who attend schools outside of their neighborhood during the school year, should check directly with the APS Transportation Office to verify that they qualify for transportation to that school during the summer.**

Unless otherwise noted, bus transportation is provided for elementary students who live more than one mile from their designated summer school. Middle and high school students are provided transportation if they live more than one and a half miles from their summer school. **A list of bus stops and additional transportation information will be sent to students by U.S. mail in early July.** Parents must arrange for younger children to be escorted to and from the bus stop.

High school students who drive to school are required to park in designated student areas.

## FOOD SERVICE

It is anticipated that food will be available for purchase at all or most summer school sites. APS students who received free or reduced cost lunch during the 2010-2011 school year, are also eligible to receive free or reduced cost meals during summer school.

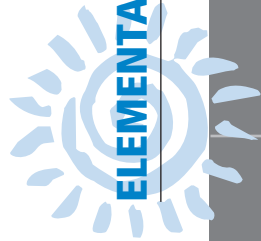

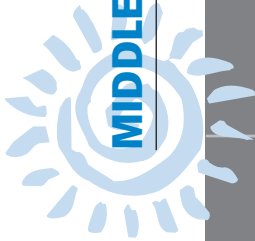

PALS support will be given to K and 1st grade children who need early literacy skills reinforced such as sound/letter recognition and reading strategies. **A snack time will be provided daily. Mathematics instruction will be based on in-depth exploration of number and operations and activities to develop computational fluency. Language arts instruction will focus on an integrated unit that includes language development, reading, writing and science concepts. This course incorporates the Standards of Learning for grades K-5 in English and mathematics, while addressing the English

Language Proficiency Standards for Virginia Public Schools. Designed to meet the Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA) mandates, this course will provide instruction as well as assessment for students in both mathematics and reading.

**III ELEMENTARY SPECIAL EDUCATION PROGRAMS**

Summer school experiences for students who receive special education services are offered to students in pre-kindergarten through grade five. A variety of programs are offered including self-contained programs and countywide specialized programs. Registration is limited to students who were enrolled full time in APS during the 2010-2011 school year and who received a self-contained level of special education service during the year. Summer school special education programs are not designed to be duplications of the regular school year programs.

**In addition to the regular registration procedure, the following items from the student's current IEP should be attached to the summer school registration form:**

- Present Levels of Performance page
- Classroom Accommodations page

**1. Individual School Based Special Education Programs, Grades K-5**

At each elementary school (cluster) site, resource services will be available for students who received this type of support during the school year. Special Education resource services during summer school will not be identical to the IEP services provided during the school year. Summer school resource teachers ensure that accommodations and modifications are in place and provide direct/group instruction as needed.

**Self-Contained Math/Language Arts, Grades K-5**

This program gives students who receive self-contained special education services during the school year the opportunity to strengthen their skills in both language arts and mathematics. Heavy emphasis will be on SOL reinforcement. This course is designed for students who can work cooperatively in groups of peers, but who require a higher level of teacher assistance to master the material. During mathematics, teaching will focus on number and number sense, computation and estimation, measurement, geometry and patterns. During language arts, students will receive support in reading, writing, speaking, study skills and research activities. They will read a wide variety of literature. The students will write about what they have read, talk about it, and complete projects that center on what they have learned in their writings.

## 2. Countywide Special Education Programs

APS also offers a variety of specialized special education programs (see below). These programs are open only to students who are currently enrolled as full time APS students and who received special education services during the 2010-11 school year. The following programs also require that students attended an equivalent program during the school year: Pre-K Developmental Program, Deaf and Hard of Hearing Class, Elementary Life Skills, MIPA and Communication Class. **Please note that all countywide programs have an early deadline of April 1, 2011. If classes exceed capacity, a random selection procedure will be used to determine program participation. Students will be notified by mail from the program office approximately three weeks after the registration period closes if their applications have not been accepted.**

### I ELIGIBILITY FOR SUMMER EXTENDED DAY SERVICES

- **June 24:** Refunds can only be granted for the conditions listed in the registration packet. No refunds can be granted if requested after June 24. Refunds may take approximately 4-6 weeks to be processed.

### V PROGRAM GUIDELINES

- Extended Day programs open at 7:00 AM and close promptly at 6:00 PM.
- Parents are responsible for ensuring their child is picked up by 6:00 PM, even if they are unable to do so themselves. Others authorized to pick up the child must be indicated on the application.
- Late pick up will result in a required 5:45 PM pick up time. Repeated lateness could result in dismissal from the program.
- An authorized adult must sign-in the child each morning and sign-out the child each afternoon; photo ID is required for sign out.
- Students are expected to attend the program daily unless the Extended Day supervisor is notified in advance. Written notification is required when/if there is a change in the student’s schedule.
- In order to administer medication during summer school, parents must arrange to have currently dated authorization forms on file in the home school clinic by June 1, 2011.
- Students must bring a lunch from home each day.
- A daily snack will be provided.
